Denominational Leadership

The Free Methodist Church USA is led by a Board of Bishops who give leadership and direction to the denomination. Our current Bishops are Matthew Whitehead, Keith Cowart, and Linda Adams. Kendall. Our Board of Bishops are elected to four year terms with elections being held at our General Conference every four years.

The Wabash Conference (our regional conference) is led by Superintendent John Lane who gives leadership and direction to the churches in the Wabash Conference; every Free Methodist Church throughout Indiana as well as the Free Methodist Churches in southeastern Illinois, Kentucky, and Tennessee.
